Occupation/personal background info: I have nearly 20 years of community service and nonprofit leadership experience. I spent seven years on the Blaine Charter Commission and

now almost two years on the Blaine City Council. I have a law degree and a people-centered approach to my work. I am proud to be the first Muslim and woman of color to be elected to the Blaine City Council.

What experience makes you uniquely qualified to represent the city?: I bring a unique perspective shaped by my background as the daughter of immigrants, my law degree, and my extensive experience in strategic planning. I have lived in Blaine for 20 years with my husband and three children and I'm deeply committed to this community. I love living in Ward 1 because it is the heart and soul of Blaine. There is so much history here and I have met so many good, genuine people. I am committed to creating a Blaine that puts residents first.

Do you think the current election system is fair?: I don't think the current election system is fair, transparent, or inclusive. When there is a lack of public trust in the legitimacy of the outcome of an election, we need to address it. I often raise issues of conflict of interest on our city council — developers run and fund candidates and this impacts how decisions are made and who benefits.

How should your city handle/create its development goals for the next 10 years?: We have great momentum: redevelopment of the Northtown mall and reducing crime in the area, the Highway 65 project, new parks and activities to bring neighborhoods together, clean water projects, a carwash moratorium, and real efforts to seek resident input and put people before profit. I am the strongest advocate for unions because of the quality of work, stability and ethical leadership unions bring to cities and projects.
